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### **East Kolkata Wetlands**

East Kolkata Wetlands (EKW) known as the "kidney" of Kolkata, naturally purifies the sewage water of the City and its surroundings through a resource recovery mechanism. EKW was included in the Ramsar list as a rare or unique wetland type under Criteria 1 of the Ramsar Convention on 19<sup>th</sup> August, 2002. Located between 22°25′N to 22°35′N and 88°20′E to 88°35′E, with the city of Kolkata on the west and River Kulti on the east, the EKW is a consortium of predominantly water dominated areas (used as fish farms) to land centric usages for agriculture, horticulture and settlements.

**I**t is a world-renowned model of multiple use wetland complex through resource recovery mechanism developed by local people with the effluxion of time. wetland complex saves the city Kolkata from the huge costs of constructing and maintaining waste water treatment plants. It is a



natural process for treating the city's waste water and utilizing the treated water for pisciculture and agriculture through the recovery of nutrients. As nutrient-rich effluent moves through the system, it is progressively cleaned, and nutrients are redirected to the growth of algae or agricultural products grown along the pond edges and agricultural lands. This wetlands complex naturally recycles nearly 910 Million Litres per day (MLD) of sewage water generated by Kolkata and its outskirts.

EKW is the world's largest sewage-fed pisciculture system. This kind of pisciculture practice provides survival opportunities for a large, economically underprivileged community living in EKW area. This traditional waste recovery system saves the State exchequer from capital expenditure of around Rs. 500 crores and from the subsequent recurring expenses. It produces more than 20,000 tons of fish and more than 50,000 tons of vegetables per annum. This area is also known as part of Kolkata's lung system. Sixty percent of carbon found in the wastewater is sequestered by the plant and animal life of the wetlands. The wetlands act as carbon sink for Kolkata.



For proper conservation and management of East Kolkata Wetlands, the Government of West Bengal framed the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and 2006 Management) Act, [EKW(C&M) Act,2006]. The Government of India also framed the has Wetlands (Conservation

and Management) Rules, 2017 [Wetlands (C&M) Rules, 2017] under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 for conservation and management of the 'wetlands of international importance under the Ramsar Convention' like East Kolkata Wetlands.

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### **East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority**

East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority (EKWMA) is a nodal government agency mandated to ensure wise use of the wetlands within the regulatory framework defined by the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 and the Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2017 notified by the Government of India under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

### 2.1 Composition of the EKWMA

EKWMA is a thirteen-member body chaired by the Hon'ble Minister-in-Charge, Department of Environment, Government of West Bengal. The Additional Chief Secretary, Department of Environment, Government of West Bengal is the Member Secretary of the EKWMA. The Commissioner, Kolkata Municipal Corporation, District Magistrates of South 24 Parganas and North 24 Parganas are permanent Invitee Members of the EKWMA. There are four expert members from the field of wetland ecology, hydrology, fisheries, and socioeconomics, who have been nominated in the Authority by virtue of Environment Department notification no. 1075/EN/EKW-05/2016(Pt-1) dated 18.08.2020.

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### **State Wetlands Authority (SWA)**

West Bengal State Wetlands Authority (SWA) has been constituted under Rule 5(1) of the Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2017 notified by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Government of India.

### 3.1 Composition of the SWA

The SWA is headed by the Hon'ble Minister-in-Charge, Department of Environment, Government of West Bengal with Chief Secretary to the Government of West Bengal being the Vice-Chairperson and the Additional Chief Secretary to the Department of Environment being the Member Secretary. There are twenty other members including five expert members in the field of wetland ecology, hydrology, fisheries, landscape planning and socioeconomics. The Department of Environment, Government of West Bengal vide its notification no. 509/EN/SWA/09/01/2021-22 dated 28.03.2022 nominated the following five expert members:

### 3.3 Staff strength of SWA

The staffs of EKWMA have also been engaged to discharge the work of the State Wetlands Authority in addition to their normal duties.

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### **Major Activities During 2021-22**

### 4.1 Conservation / Protection of East Kolkata Wetlands

To conserve and protect the East Kolkata Wetlands, the State Government framed East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 and Rules thereunder. As per Section 3 of the EKW(C&M) Act, 2006, East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority was constituted to enforce the Act, 2006 properly for conservation of the wetlands. Further, the EKW was governed by the Wetlands (C&M) Rules, 2010 which has now been superseded by the Wetlands (C&M) Rules, 2017 notified by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Government of India.

### 4.1.1 Complaint Lodges against violation of the EKW Act, 2006

Being the on eastern fringes of the developing city of Kolkata, EKW faces several threats of encroachments and illegal constructions from the rapidly expanding city. **EKWMA** undertakes various activities to protect and conserve the vast land of 12,500Ha of land. Upon finding any unauthorized



activity in the EKW, the staffs of the EKWMA conducts field inspection with the assistance of concerned police authorities to confirm whether any illegal activity has taken place or not. After being confirmed that an illegal activity has taken place, EKWMA serves notice to the

violator to immediately stop the illegal activity, and lodges complaint with the local police station to take action in accordance with law. EKWMA also uses the GIS platform for ground level validation of the violation. To date, 440 complaints with various police stations have been lodged by the EKWMA against the violation of the EKW(C&M) Act, 2006; while during this financial year 31 complaints have been lodged.

# 4.1.2 Implementation of Section 11 of the EKW (C&M) Act, 2006 and Orders of the Hon'ble High Court

EKWMA issues order to restore the land / water body to its original character at his own expense, after providing hearing opportunity to the violators. During the financial year 2021-2022, EKWMA provided opportunity of hearing to the violators in compliance with the provisions of Section 11 of the EKW (C&M) Act, 2006 and in compliance of the Orders of Hon'ble High Court of Calcutta vide case no. WPO/541/2017 dated 24.12.2021 and case no. W.P.A.No.1323 of 2022 dated 23.02.2022, EKWMA provided opportunity of hearing to the violators and passed Reasoned Orders:

# **4.1.3 Demolition of Unauthorized Constructions and Restoration of Water Body**

As per section 11 of the EKW (C&M) Act, 2006, failing the compliance of the directions of the reasoned order EKWMA undertakes restoration work of the land / water body to its original character and recover the cost thereof as arrears of land revenue. During this financial year following restoration works have been taken place.

i) EKWMA noticed that an illegal two-storey building has been constructed by filling up three adjacent water bodies namely Boro Bongheri, Choto Bongheri and Rabi Ghosher Bheri at Mouza Dhapa Manpur under North 24-Parganas district. EKWMA lodged complaint to South Bidhannagar Police Station





and served a Stop Work Notice. Incompliance with Orders the of Hon'ble High Court vide case no. WPO/541/2017 and section 11 of the EKW (C&M) 2006, Act, **EKWMA** passed reasoned order

with the direction upon the violator to dismantle the unauthorized building within a stipulated period at his own cost after providing them an opportunity of hearing. Due to non-compliance with the aforesaid reasoned order, EKWMA requested the District Magistrate, North 24 Parganas to demolish the unauthorized building. Accordingly, the demolition of the building took place in March 2022.



**EKWMA** lodged ii) complaint Pragati with Maidan Police Station after finding construction of an illegal boundary wall by filling up a part of water body at RS Dag No. 305, 306 and 307 of Dhalenda Mouza under South 24 Parganas district. Accordingly, as per section 11 of the EKW (C&M)

Act,2006 and in compliance with the Order of National Green Tribunal, Eastern Zone Branch, Kolkata in case no. O.A. No. 32/2019/EZ, EKWMA requested KMC to dismantle the boundary wall and restore the water body in its original character. In this regard, EKWMA released a fund of Rs. 9,04,780/- in favour of the Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC). The restoration work was completed in February 2022.

### 4.2 Reply to Right to Information Act

Right to Information Act, 2005 (RTI) mandates timely response to public queries for government information. The basic object of the RTI Act is to empower the citizens, promote transparency and accountability in the working of the Government and make the democracy work for the people in real sense. Being a 'Public Authority', the EKWMA is committed to maintain accountability and transparency, and make the Right to Information Act, 2005 effectively operational. 22 applications under RTI Act, 2005 has been received and subsequently replied to the people during the financial year 2021-2022.

### 4.3 Status of Court Cases

Besides the criminal cases filed in the lower courts by the police based on complaints of the EKWMA, there are several civil suits filed against East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority in the Hon'ble Calcutta High Court and the Hon'ble National Green Tribunal (NGT), Eastern Zone Bench, Kolkata. At present, all cases before NGT is disposed. The list of pending cases before the Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta relating to East Kolkata Wetlands is given in Annexure-VII.

### 4.4 Boundary Demarcation of East Kolkata Wetlands

Notwithstanding the area East Kolkata Wetlands is defined in Section 2 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006, there is a provision for demarcating **EKW** physically. the area National Green Tribunal, Eastern Zone Branch, Kolkata on 27.10.2021 in the matter of (Subhas Dutta -Vs- State of



West Bengal & Ors. vide no. O.A. No. 32/2019/EZ) directed to demarcate the boundary of the EKW on the ground level by erecting pillars. In compliance with the above directions, the EKWMA has taken initiative in physical demarcation of EKW boundaries. The Authority requested Directorate of Land Records and Surveys (DLRS) for putting monolith pillars along the vast area of the East Kolkata Wetlands. The DLRS has engaged Zilla Parishad, South 24-Parganas for the jurisdiction of South 24- Parganas district and Public Works Department of Dist. North 24 Parganas for North 24 Parganas district. Subsequently, EKWMA has released Rs. 10.86 Lakhs in total for this purpose.

### 4.5 Plantation Programme within East Kolkata Wetlands

Like every year, EKWMA initiated tree plantation different programme at locations within the EKW area for this year. This year 5,269 fruit bearing tree species has been planted. All saplings are protected by tree protection guard. Sign board is also erected in all locations where plantation has been carried



out for awareness of the local community about plantation programme. The cost of the plantation programme is Rs. 1,02,13,265/-.

## 4.6 Revision and Approval of Integrated Management Plan of East Kolkata Wetlands 2022-2027

East Kolkata Wetlands has its immense value to the city Kolkata and its surroundings. Despite being a wetlands complex of international importance the water bodies of the EKW are being depleted due to several challenges like water body filling and unauthorised construction. As per the provision of the prevailing Act and Rules and considering numerous challenges, it is necessary to formulate a Management Action Plan of EKW for conservation of wetlands and sustainable development of this area by ensuring livelihood opportunity for the wetland communities.

Accordingly, EKWMA prepared East Kolkata Wetlands Management Action Plan 2021-2026 (MAP) as per the Guidelines of the National Plan for Conservation of Aquatic Ecosystems (NPCA) with technical support from Wetland International South Asia (WISA). The budget of the Management Action Plan is Rs. 119.8 crore. The MAP is also approved by the Authority.

Thereafter, the Integrated Management Plan of East Kolkata Wetlands 2021-2026 (IMP) (formerly East Kolkata Wetlands Management Action Plan 2021-2026) is revised as per the suggestion of MoEF&CC with budgetary provision of Rs. 110.72 crore. As the IMP is under a centrally sponsored scheme (CSS) of the NPCA, the Central Government's share of the total budget is 60%, whereas the State Government's share of the total budget is 40% for a period of 5 years. The State Government of West Bengal approved the IMP in Auguest, 2021 in principle and committed to provide the share i.e. 40% of the budget of IMP (Rs. 110.72 crore) after release of Central's share. The revised IMP along with the Letter of Commitment of State Share was sent to the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) for final approval.

Several activities have been taken to conserve and maintain the EKW in a sustainable manner in the IMP of EKW. Following work components are prescribed in the IMP:

- Maintaining Land use and land cover of the wetland in line with regulatory requirements under Wetlands (Conservation & Management) Rules, 2017 and East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation & Management) Act, 2006.
- Treating efficiently the quality and quantity of sewage received within the wetland applying traditional waste recovery practices.
- Maintaining the Biodiversity within East Kolkata Wetlands.
- Reducing invasion species threats in fisheries.
- Reducing risk of sustainable livelihood.
- Enhance Individual and collective capacity and opportunities of stakeholders and wetland communities for participation in wetland management and contribute wise use of the wetland.
- To take decision and assess effectiveness through Systematic wetlands inventory, assessment and monitoring system.
- Enhance Integration of multiple values of wetlands for sectoral development planning.

### 4.7 Canal De-siltation Work

For conservation of the ecosystem services of East Kolkata Wetlands it imperative maintain to optimum level water conducive to pisciculture overall and water management within the water bodies. As water is infused into water bodies of **EKW** through different canals, it is necessary to de-



silt canals within EKW area. It is proposed in the Integrated Management Plan (IMP), 14 canals need to be de-silted at present because these are highly silted. Accordingly, Water Resources Investigation & Development Department (WRI&DD) has been requested for desiltation of the canals in the EKW area.

### 4.8 Solid Waste Management

Two Civil Society Organizations namely Amra Susama Jalprapat and BITAN Institute of Training Awareness and Networking showed their interest to implement Solid Waste Management in EKW area and submitted the proposal for the project. In this regard, EKWMA approached Department of Environment for allocation of fund to implement the Solid Waste Management project. The Department has given administrative approval for an amount of Rs. 25.31Lakhs for this purpose. Accordingly, the Authority has initiated to implement of Solid Waste Management at Kheadaha II Gram Panchayats and Bamanghata Gram Panchayats in the EKW area.

### 5

### **Awareness Generation Programme**

### 5.1 World Wetlands Day

Every year 2<sup>nd</sup> February is celebrated as World Wetlands Day. The Day also marks the date of the adoption of the Convention on Wetlands on 2 February 1971, in the Iranian city of Ramsar on the shores of the Caspian Sea. That's why this convention is known as Ramsar Convention.



World Wetlands Day was observed as the 'United Nations International Day' in 2022 following its adoption by the General Assembly on 30<sup>th</sup> August 2021. The theme for the 2022 edition was 'Wetlands Action for People and Nature', and it highlights the importance of actions that ensure that wetlands are conserved and sustainably used. It's an appeal to invest financial, human and political capital to save the world's wetlands from disappearing and to restore those which have been degraded. The overriding message behind this year's campaign was to Value, Manage, Restore, and of course — Love — Wetlands, because if we are to inspire action, we also must ignite greater empathy for these rapidly disappearing ecosystems.

 Value wetlands for the multiple benefits and nature-based solutions they provide for human well-being and a healthy planet.

- Manage wetlands wisely and use them sustainably so that we can conserve them and maintain the health of these critically important ecosystems.
- Restore lost and degraded wetlands to revive the rich biodiversity and life found in these life-sustaining ecosystems.

The day is celebrated to aware people across the world about the importance of wetlands and its ecosystem for the planet. Wetlands are the source of freshwater and it's a solution of nature for storm water buffering, flood control, water quality preservation and groundwater recharge, erosion protection and provide nurseries for fish and other freshwater and marine animals and carbon sequestration.





West Bengal has two Ramsar sites namely East Kolkata Wetlands Sundarban Wetlands. Based on the theme of the World Wetlands Day, 2022 EKWMA celebrated World Wetlands Day this year at Nalban-1 Bheri. EKWMA organized one day programme by involving youth and local communities of EKW. A civil society organisation namely Nature Environment & Wildlife Society (NEWS) took a vital part to make the successful. programme Several activities have taken place for conservation of wetlands in this event:



- Demonstration of the importance of East Kolkata Wetlands and spreading awareness to preserve it.
- Release of one quintal fingerlings of India Major Carp species (Rohu, Katla, Mrigel, Bata, etc.) in Nalban 1 Bheri.
  - Conduct Water
- quality monitoring including various physical and chemical tests such as pH, temperature, DO, transparency, turbidity, nitrate, TAN, phosphate. Fish farmers and citizens collect samples and take an active part in conducting the tests.
- A cleaning drive has been arranged to manage solid wastes at Nalban 1 Bheri area.
   Besides a 'Nature Walk' programme took place to study the aquatic species, bird species and butterflies dwelling in the EKW.

### 5.2 Roaming of LED Mounted Mobile Van



As a part of awareness campaign two LED mounted mobile vans were moving in and around the East Kolkata Wetlands area with an audio-visual massage on importance of East Kolkata Wetlands. This campaign attracted a lots of public attention and hadd positive impact among the local people.

Local Panchayats also appreciate this type of awareness campaign. During this financial year 2021-2022, EKWMA spent Rs. 1.06 crore for this purpose.

### 5.3 Workshop on East Kolkata Wetlands

East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority organized a workshop with the local fisherman community. The tag line of the programme "Jalabhumi Baluk, Kolkata Shunuk". The workshop was held at Bamanghata Gram Panchayat office on 5<sup>th</sup> October, 2021. Local people of EKW area took



part in the workshop and became the 'Wetland Mitra' (Wetland Friend) for saving East Kolkata Wetlands.

# 5.4 Trips to East Kolkata Wetlands Cycling Trip:

A bicycle trip was conducted during the month of July, 2021 to aware the local people about the immense importance of wetlands.



### Madras School of Economics:

One field visit was arranged in the month of September, 2021 to share the needs of the East Kolkata Wetlands the students faculty of the Department of Environmental Economics of the Madras School of Economics for their research on valuation of the ecosystem service of EKW.



#### **Judicial Visit:**

Visit of Hon'ble Mr. Justice B. Amit Sthalekar, Judicial Member and Hob'ble Mr. Justice Saibal Dasgupta, Expert Member of the Hon'ble National Green Tribunal, Eastern Zone Bench visited East Kolkata Wetlands in the month of February, 2022.

WHEREAS it is necessary to nominate four Expert Members of the East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority under Section 2(2)(x) of East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) (Amendment) Act, 2017 and Rule 3(1) of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2006;

The Court:- Mainly two issues have been raised by learned counsel appearing for the petitioners. First is in respect of a double storied unauthorised construction which has been raised at Baro Bon Bheri, Chhoto Bon Bheri and Rabi Ghosher Bheri under P.S. Bighannagar (South), District North 24 Parganas and second larger issue in respect of the illegal construction on the wetlands in violation of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006

and also in violation of the Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2017.

So far as the first issue in respect of the double storied illegal construction on the wetlands as noted above is concerned, in the affidavit dated 20<sup>th</sup> December, 2021 filed by Sri Supratim Sarkar, IPS, it is clearly stated that initially, a mere single storied building was constructed and within one and a half years, this building has been turned into doubled storied building. Affidavit further mentions about registration of FIR at Bidhannagar South P.S. being Case No.69 of 2020 and filing of Charge Sheet No.132/2021 against the accused. Affidavit dated 21<sup>st</sup> December 2021 filed on behalf of respondent Nos.4 and 5 mentions that the above building has been sealed.

Learned Advocate General has submitted that in terms of Section 11 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 [for short, 'Act of 2006'], the person responsible for raising the construction is required to be noticed and demolition is to be done at his own expense for restoration of the land to the original character. He has submitted that since the necessary facilities are available with the Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation, therefore, a direction be issued to extend the help to the State Authority for carrying out the demolition.

The person who has allegedly raised the above construction is represented today through his advocate who has submitted that he has not been impleaded in this petition. The concerned person will be given due opportunity of hearing by the State Authority under the Act before taking action of demolition, therefore, his impleadment is not necessary in this petition.

Hence, we direct the concerned authority under the Act to take expeditious action in terms of Section 11 of the Act and give an opportunity of hearing to the person responsible for the illegal construction and complete the exercise in terms of the said Section as expeditiously as possible preferably within a period of four weeks from today. Bidhannagar Municipal Corporation is directed to extend full

help and cooperation to the concerned authority for the purpose of restoration of the land to its original position.

A larger issue has been raised by learned counsel for the petitioner in respect of the maintenance of the wetlands in the entire State. In this regard, he has referred to the orders of the Supreme Court dated 03.04.2017 and 16.08.2017 passed in WP (S) (Civil) No.230/2021 in the case of M.K. Balakrishnan & Ors. v. Union of India & Ors. and has highlighted the importance of management and preservation of the wetlands. He has also referred to the preamble of the Act of 2006, which emphasizes the need for such conservation and management of the East Kolkata Wetlands. Detailed rules i.e. the Rules of 2017 have been framed by the Central Government in exercise of the powers under Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and Rule 4 thereof clearly provides for restriction of activities in wetlands and in terms of Rule 5, the State Wetlands Authority in each State has been constituted.

This Court, by an order dated 14th June 2019, had impleaded the State Wetlands Authority of the State of West Bengal in this petition as additional respondent and the Learned Advocate General had taken notice on behalf of the Authority on that date. The record further reflects that on 14th June 2019, this Court had directed the Government of West Bengal as well as all the executive authorities and police authorities to ensure that that there is no activity in any part of the wetlands to which the 2017 Rules apply except in strict conformity with these Rules and after taking requisite permission from the competent authority under these Rules. Schedule-1 of the Act of 2006 contains the details of East Kolkata Wetlands by mentioning the Dag number, Sheet number etc. Therefore, the wetland area of the East Kolkata has already been identified and specified under the Act.

The Chief Secretary being the Vice Chairman of the West Bengal State Wetlands Authority is directed to get the details of the existing position of illegal construction on the East Kolkata Wetlands prepared through the concerned authority and place it before this Court in tabulated form on or before the next

date of hearing. He is also directed to get all the wetlands of the State identified and place the details thereof before this Court on or before the next date of hearing.

The petitioner alleges that a construction is going on at Plot No.1463, J.L. No.6 under Mouza-Dharmatala, Police Station-Kolkata Leather Complex, District-South 24-Parganas, without appropriate permission from the East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority (hereinafter referred to as the said Authority).

The petitioner relies on a communication from the Technical Officer of the said Authority dated December 21, 2021 by which the Inspector-in-Charge, Kolkata Leather Complex Police Station, was requested to enquire into the matter on the basis of the complaint of the petitioner. It has

been specifically mentioned in the said communication that the entire area under J.L. No.6 falls within the jurisdiction of the said Authority and except with the sanction from the said Authority under Section 9 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), no construction of permanent nature, could be made. The petitioner, thus, bases his entire claim for demolition of the construction made by the respondent Nos.10 to 13 on the basis of such communication.

Records reveal that the panchayat authorities had granted due permission to the respondent Nos.10 to 13 to raise the construction. The panchayat authorities are not present before the Court despite service. The police authorities have filed a report indicating the on the basis of the communication of the Technical Officer, Kolkata Leather Complex Police Station Case No.07 dated January 29, 2022 under Section 18 of the said Act, has been registered and the investigation is in progress.

As the police authorities have already acted on the basis of the communication of the Technical Officer of the said Authority, it is directed that no further construction shall take place for a period of 10 (ten) days. Within such time, the competent authority of the East Kolkata Wetlands

Management Authority shall dispose of the complaint of the petitioner, which is annexure P2 at page 18 of the writ petition, in accordance with law upon hearing the petitioner, representative of the respondent Nos.10 to 13 and all other interested parties including the Pradhan of Beonta Gram Panchayat, District-South 24-Parganas. A reasoned order shall be passed and communicated to all concerned.

It is made clear that the authority will only decide as to whether the construction by the petitioner as well as the respondents Nos. 10 to 13 were in accordance with law. The same law shall apply to all.

The question of validity of the sanction plan will come into question, only when the said Authority decides that the construction made by the respondent Nos.10 to 13 were not permissible in law.

This writ petition is, thus, disposed of.

In view of disposal of the writ petition the connected application has become infructuous and the same is disposed of accordingly.

There will be no order as to costs.

# WPO 541 of 2017 People United for Better Living in Calcutta Vs The Union of India & Ors

Reasoned Order in compliance with the Order of the Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta dated 24.12.2021

#### Background of the case:

On 19.05.2021 East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority (EKWMA) was apprised of filing Case no. 69/21 dated 03.03.2021 by Bidhannagar South Police Station. In reply to the said communication the EKWMA informed the police that Dag nos. 1527, 1528, 1552, 1553, 1563, 1612, 1613, 1614, 1615, 1616, 1617, 1618, 1619, 1620, 1621, 1622, 1623, 1643, 1649, 1650, 1651, 1652, 1752, 1755, 1760, 1797, 1798 of Mouza Dhapa Manpur, JL no. 1 fall within the East Kolkata Wetlands. EKWMA also informed that *Choto Bongheri Bheri*, *Boro Bongheri Bheri* and *Rabi Ghosher Bheri* in Mouza Dhapa Manpur, JL no. 1, PS South Bidhannagar, Dist North 24 Parganas are within the East Kolkata Wetlands.

EKWMA on 30.06.2021 forwarded two complaints — i) from the People United for Better Living in Calcutta (PUBLIC) dated 22.06.2021 and (ii) from the Society for Creative Opportunities and Participatory Ecosystems (SCOPE), Kolkata dated 09.06.2021 — to South Bidhannagar PS. Chief Technical Officer, EKWMA sent another communication dated 16.07.2021 to the Commissioner of Police, Bidhannagar Police Commissionerate with intimation that the aforesaid three water bodies were filled up and a two storey permanent building was constructed thereon by violating the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 and the Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2017 notified by the Government of India.

On 26.08.2021 EKWMA wanted to know the name of the accused person and status of Case no. 69/21 dated 03.03.2021 filed by the police from South Bidhannagar PS. In reply dated 31.08.2021, the police informed the name of Kajeul Sardar, S/o. Oajed Sardar of Village Nittyananda Kathi, PS Swarupnagar, Dist. North 24 Parganas and also informed that a two storied building existed at the subject land since last 3 to 4 years.

Pertinently, in the matter of WPO No 541 of 2017 the Commissioner of Police, Bidhannagar Police Commissionerate stated that Inspector-in-Charge of Bidhannagar South PS visited the spot and enquired about it. From the police

enquiry it came to the light that a single storey building was constructed four years back. But, within one and a half

years the building was turned into a two storey building.

EKWMA requested the Commissioner of Police, Bidhannagar Police Commissionerate and the Chairman cum

Managing Director, West Bengal State Electricity Distribution Company Limited to comply with the Order dated

29.11.2021 passed by the High Court at Calcutta.

EKWMA served stop work notice on 17.09.2021 which was received by a representative of Kajeul Sardar namely

Rajib Lal Dhar. The Additional Chief Secretary, Environment Department and Member Secretary, East Kolkata

Wetlands Management Authority through a communication dated 17.12.2021 requested the District Magistrate, North

24 Parganas to lock and seal the building at Bon Gheri Bheri at Mouza Dhapa Manpur, JL no. 1, PS South

Bidhannagar. In reply, the SDO, Bidhannagar on 19.12.2021 communicated that locking and sealing of the subject

property was done.

In compliance with the Order dated 24.12.2021 of the Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta an opportunity of hearing was

provided to Kajeul Sardar under Section 11 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006

on 24.01.2022. But, owing to non-delivery of the hearing notice the accused person was not present at the hearing. So,

he was again provided with another opportunity of hearing on 31.01.2022.

Hearing:

Kajeul Sardar was called for the hearing on 31.01.2022 where he was present with his lawyer Shri Arindam Sen. They

submitted a written submission which is as follows:

During the hearing he has admitted that he made the construction without securing permission of the East Kolkata

Wetlands Management Authority for providing accommodation to his labourers. In the written statement he has stated

that he made some addition and alteration, and some repairing in the subject construction. However, he has also

admitted to demolish the constructed structure within the stipulated timeline of the order as and when issued.

Considering the above facts, Kajeul Sardar is hereby directed to dismantle the constructed building within 15 days

from the date of issue of this letter, failing which East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority will take necessary

steps under Section 11 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006.

All concerned may be informed accordingly.

Reasoned Order in compliance with the Order of the Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta dated 23.02.2022

#### Background of the case:

Smt. Kamini Bayen and her daughter Smt. Sandhya Sardar submitted complaint letters to East Kolkata Wetlands Management Authority (EKWMA) against the unauthorized building construction made at RS Dag no. 1463, Mouza Dharmatala Pachuria, JL no. 06, PS Kolkata Leather Complex (KLC), Dist 24 South Parganas (hereinafter referred to as the "subject land"), which is within the East Kolkata Wetlands (EKW). On the basis of the said complaint, the EKWMA on 21.12.2021 lodged a complaint against violation of the provisions of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 (hereinafter referred to as the "EKW Act of 2006") with PS KLC. The police started KLC PS Case no. 07 dated 29.01.2022, which is under investigation.

As per Schedule I of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006 the subject land is classified as "Urban/Rural settlement area (full)". As per the Record of Rights (RoR) the subject land is classified as "Bastu".

Smt. Sandhya Sardar filed WPA No. 1323 of 2022 before the Hon'ble High Court at Calcutta against Shri Rabin Bayen, Biswanath Bayen, Sankar Bayen and Samir Bayen (Respondent nos. 10, 11, 12 and 13 respectively of the instant Writ Petition) *et al* for the alleged unauthorized construction of building. From the Writ Petition it has come to the knowledge of the EKWMA that a Partition Suit bearing TS no. 3481 of 2008 was filed by the instant Writ Petitioner in Alipore Court for the same subject land, which is still pending.

While delivering its judgment dated 23.02.2022, the Hon'ble High Court has directed the EKWMA to dispose of the complaint in accordance with law upon hearing the petitioner, respondent nos. 10 to 13 and all other interested parties including Pradhan of Beonta Gram Panchayat, Dist South 24 Parganas. In compliance with the said judgment dated 23.02.2022, the EKWMA called all the interested parties including Smt. Sandhya Sardar (the writ petitioner) and all the respondents to a hearing on 16.03.2022.

Hearing:

The writ petitioner, the respondent nos. 10 to 13 along their lawyer Shri Dilip Kumar Mandal and a representative of

the Officer-in-Charge of PS KLC attended the hearing. During the hearing the writ petitioner and the respondent nos.

10 to 13 stated that the aforesaid Partition Suit bearing TS no. 3481 of 2008 for partition of the subject land is still

pending in the Alipore Court. The respondent nos. 10 to 13 admitted that the unauthorized construction has been made

by them in the year 2021, and the same has been submitted in their written statements.

**Decision of the EKWMA:** 

Considering the above facts, it is clear that Shri Rabin Bayen, Shri Biswanath Bayen, Shri Sankar Bayen and Shri

Samir Bayen (respondent nos. 10 to 13) have made unauthorized construction at RS Dag no. 1463, Mouza Dharmatala

Pachuria, JL no. 06, PS Kolkata Leather Complex (KLC), Dist South 24 Parganas. The said unauthorized building

construction has been made by violating the provisions of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management)

Act, 2006 as well as the provisions of the Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2017. As per Rule

4(2)(vi) of the Wetlands Rules of 2017, any construction of a permanent nature is prohibited within the East Kolkata

Wetlands. Therefore, respondent nos. 10 to 13 namely Shri Biswanath Bayen, Shri Sankar Bayen and Shri Samir

Bayen are, hereby, directed to demolish the unauthorized building construction and restore the subject land to its

previous status at their own cost within a period of one month from the date of issue of this Reasoned Order

under Section 11 of the East Kolkata Wetlands (Conservation and Management) Act, 2006. In case of default by them,

the EKWMA shall direct Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC) to undertake the demolition of the said unauthorized building and restoration of the subject land to its previous status, and thereafter, take steps to recover the cost thereof

from the aforesaid persons.

All concerned may be informed accordingly.


